SNAP Sneaks a Peek

The Passage of Time and Tradition

Last week, I took a short cut through Williamson Road Public School. In the back schoolyard, I stood and looked at two entranceways. Above each entry, etched in stone, were BOYS and the other GIRLS. I marveled that while both my children attended "Willy" the affectionate, familiar, nick name of the school, built in 1913, I had never noticed the dedication of gender

Perhaps way back then, as a young mother, I did see the inscriptions but never gave any thought to the growth from one era to the next. The third floor of Williamson Road was added in 1919, most likely to accommodate the influx of children from the vastly developing neighbourhood. Surrounded by Beaufort Road, Glen Manor, Pine Crescent, Lee Avenue and many new and budding streets. Expansion of the school was most likely anticipated.

Standing in the sun, observing the entrances, brought back memories of my children standing in line at the front of the school. Boys and girls mixed in lines laughing and teasing each other, ready for another exciting day. Then I imagined my mother, born in 1933 and a graduate of Williamson, standing neatly dressed at the back entrance for girls with the separate accompanying line of boys all ready for their day at school.

We are so lucky, I think, to live in a community where so many people have walked in the same places. Family, a place where one or more started and their descendants carry on.

Almost one hundred years since the back, gender equated entrances opened their doors, the students of today's Williamson Road, stand together, all in a mixed bundle of male and female.

The simple stepping stones of life, left innocently through our past, should always be preserved, for they become a measurement of perception, evolution and education.

Hopefully one day, I will hold the hand of a grandchild, point out the quaintness of an era gone by, sit in the sunshine and appreciate a golden moment, many moments, embedded quietly above an entrance way.
